Sauvignon Blanc	A renowned grape from France's Loire Valley, now grown worldwide. Learn how climate and winemaking shape its freshness, aromatic complexity, and lively character.
Chardonnay	Originating from Burgundy, France, discover this widely cultivated white grape, remarkable for its ability to express the terroir where it is grown and reflect the winemaker's unique style.
Riesling	One of the world's most prestigious grapes, Riesling from Germany's Rhine Valley shows how soil, climate, and regional techniques shape its balance of acidity, sweetness, and elegance.
Pinot Noir	Originating from Burgundy, France, embark on a journey to discover this ancient grape, which has thrived across many terroirs beyond its homeland, where the soil and winemaking approach create wines with a remarkably diverse aromatic palette.
Syrah / Shiraz	A cross of Mondeuse Blanche and Dureza from France's Rhône Valley, this beloved grape, known as Shiraz in Australia, shows how climate and winemaking shape its bold, balanced, and intense character.
Cabernet Sauvignon	First cultivated in the 17th century in Bordeaux, France, this grape is the natural offspring of Cabernet Franc and Sauvignon Blanc. Now grown across the globe, its ability to adapt to different terroirs allows it to develop rich and complex aromas, producing wines to be savoured without hesitation.
Merlot	Originating and long cultivated in Bordeaux, France, this renowned grape is now grown in many wine regions worldwide. Each terroir and winemaking approach imparts a distinct character, resulting in wines that reveal unique expressions depending on where and how they are grown.
